No let-up in Christmas lights fundraising drive

Fundraising is continuing for Tenterden's Christmas lights, despite reports that the £15,000 target had been reached.

Cllr Alan Sugden told a town council meeting that the money was in place to decorate 10 High Street trees this year and another 12 next year.

New lights are being bought thanks to an agreement between the council and Tenterden Chamber of Commerce, after the original ones went missing last year.

Jonathan Medes, events officer for the chamber, said the £15,000 target for replacement lights would be reached if future fundraising events met expectations.

"We still have collection boxes out and have two events lined up next month," said Mr Medes.

"If everything goes to plan, we will get the money we need to light up 10 trees."
